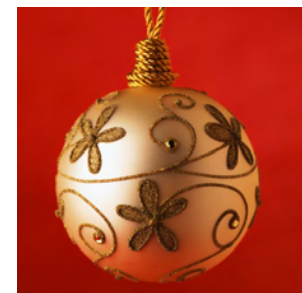

General Meeting Minutes October 30, 2009

Danielle Morgan, President, called the meeting to order at 9:35 a.m. Quorum was met for voting that will take place during the meeting.

Ray Barreras moved that the September minutes be approved as published with a second on the motion by Helena Krapp. Olwynne Crampton, Treasurer, reported the Guild has \$71,000 in various accounts. Rose Archer introduced 2 guests.

The December meeting will be the annual holiday party. Ham and turkey will be provided and members are asked to bring a side dish or dessert. Those wishing to participate in the gift exchange should bring an apron of their

Danielle asked for questions on the proposed by-law changes published in the October newsletter. There being no questions, Lila Scott made a motion that the by-law changes be approved as published with a 2nd on the motion by Peg Johns. Twenty-three proxies were received in favor of the changes. There was no opposition to the changes either via proxy or by members present.

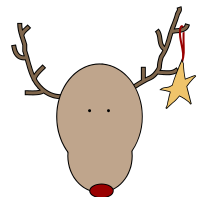

Danielle thanked everyone for his or her hard work and support in making this a successful year for the Guild.

Job descriptions for all Committee Chairmen positions are due to Danielle and Pat today.

Since there is no General meeting in November, a November/December newsletter will be published. Articles for this newsletter may be sent to Barb Cutler on or before November 18th. Barb will send out an email reminder.

Olwynne Crampton presented the 2010 guild budget. A motion to accept the budget as presented was made by Jan Cunningham with a second on the motion by Barb Cutler.

Pat Allen has received bids of just under \$1400 per year for Directors & Officers Liability insurance. Bonding of the Guild Treasurer

investigating the D&O insurance suggested that the Guild does not need bonding at this time but rather putting a few safeguards in place would probably be adequate. One of the suggestions is to require 2 signatures on checks over a certain amount, and another was to have the monthly bank statement mailed to a Board of Directors member other than the Treasurer. The bank statement is currently being mailed to Danielle each month. After much discussion among those present, a motion was made by Robin Meyer to forego bonding of the Treasurer at this time with a second on the motion by Melinda Fulkerson. There was no opposition to the motion. With the start of the 2010 Guild year, procedures will be put in place to require 2 signatures on checks over \$1,000 and monthly bank statements will continue to be mailed to the Guild President. Funding for the D&O insurance has been included in the 2010 budget.

Pat Allen reported a summary of the By-law changes would be published in the October newsletter with a link to the full By-laws on the Guild Website. Voting on the changes will take place during the October General meeting. A proxy form for voting on the changes will be published in the October newsletter.

Officers as well as the Committee Chairmen for the upcoming year. Efforts by the Nominating Committee to fill the Second Vice President position were fruitless. The Executive Committee voted in favor of asking the Guild membership for a one-year, one-time only exemption to the term limits for 2nd Vice President so that Pam Cornutt can continue in this position in 2010. This request will be

published in the October newsletter along with a proxy form for voting by those unable to attend the October General meeting during which voting will take place. Olwynne Crampton made a motion that the Executive Committee approve the proposed slate of officers with a second on the motion by Pam Cornutt. There was no opposition. The slate will be published in the November/December newsletter and voting will take place during the December General Meeting.

Dee Williams opened discussion on continuing printed publication of the Guild directory versus providing it electronically. Robin Meyer suggested emailing a copy of the directory to those members with email. After much discussion it was decided by those present that beginning in January members would be offered the option of receiving a paper copy of the directory or to receive it electronically.

Danielle Morgan adjourned the meeting at 11:40 a.m. This is the last scheduled Executive Committee meeting for 2009.
