February Speaker and Workshops

This month we are going to Italy and 'In the Round'. Our Friday morning lecture is *'Bella, Bella Patchwork'*. Norah McMeeking will have slides and real quilts based on Italian mosaic floor designs. She says that the Italian floors inspire sampler quilts that allow secondary patterns to be explored, and that distinctive bands can be created using appliqué as well as piecing. Come see a little of Italy here in Atlanta!

She will be teaching two workshops 'In the Round'. On Thursday Norah will teach us to *'Draw in the Round'*. Bring your compass (see the website for a complete supply list) and learn to draw your own original round quilt design. You can draw and explore your own creativity, while Norah is available to help you navigate your way. You can take advantage of her experience as you plan your own original quilt design.

Then, on Saturday, learn to *'Sew in the Round'*. Using techniques that Norah has perfected, learn to sew your beautiful creation. And, if you are unable to attend the Thursday workshop, Norah has several patterns for sale so you can still learn to sew a stunning round quilt.

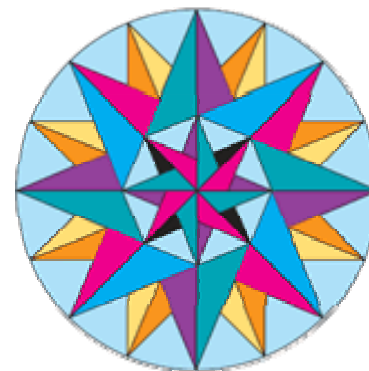

ECQG January Meeting Minutes - 1/30/2009

Danielle Morgan, Guild President, called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. Danielle welcomed everyone to the first meeting in 2009 and made the following announcements:

Raffle quilt tickets are available for pickup from Janice Kuhns. Each ECQG member is encouraged to sell, or purchase, at least 20 tickets.

The deadline for newsletter items is the 4th of each month and should be emailed to Barb Cutler, Newsletter Editor, at newsletter@ecqg.com.

An annual review of the Guild books will take place. The review team will consist of Kathy Niemann, Olwynne Crompton, Danielle Morgan, Deborah Jones and Lynda Smith.

Phyllis Schiwal moved that the December minutes be approved as published with a second on the motion by Ray Barreras. Olwynne Crompton, Treasurer, announced that the Guild has \$53,362.62 in various accounts.

Rose Archer introduced 4 guests and Dee Williams announced that the Guild currently has 136 members, with 102 present at today's meeting. Quite a few renewals were turned in today and are not included in the counts above.

Jan Cunningham and Suzanne Blair-Bowyer, Guild Publicity, have bookmarks and posters containing upcoming program information ready for distribution to local quilt shops and libraries. Jan asked for ideas of other locations where they might distribute these items. Every Guild member is encouraged to publicize the Guild by bringing friends to the meetings and telling anyone they meet about the Guild. Information on the February workshops and signup for the workshops is available at the Programs table.

Ray Barreras awarded 5 Golden Scissors. Nancy Hutchison announced that 8 charity quilts were turned in this month. 22 members participated in Show and Tell.

Phyllis Schiwal read a thank you note from the recipient of the door prize donated by ECQG to the Georgia Quilt Council's Fall Convention. The Spring Convention will take place in March and Phyllis asked ECQG members to donate items such as fat quarters, notions, and unused packs of charm squares to fill one super satchel as we did in the fall. Ray Barreras presented information on 3 classes that will be offered during the Spring Convention.

Libby Lowe, Bee Groups Chairman, announced the first meeting of the NewBee's would be at her house at 10:00 a.m. on February 6th. New members, as well as all members who are not in a Bee, are welcome to attend. Libby will be contacting

the existing Bee groups to determine which groups have openings for new members.

2009 Challenge Quilts will be displayed during the March General Meeting. Lynda Smith gave a reminder that quilts of all sizes may be part of the Guild challenge but to be considered for entry into the Knoxville AQS Show quilts must be 30" to 60" in both width and length. Those selected for entry into the Knoxville Show must have a 4" sleeve attached as well as a label with the name and phone number of the owner. Lynda requested that everyone displaying a Challenge Quilt during the March meeting provide her with the title of the song his or her quilt depicts prior to the March meeting.

Robin Meyer, 2009 Quilt Show Chairman, introduced the 2009 Show Committee Chairman. Karen Berthelot, Publicity Chairman, requested that members forward the e-newsletter, spread the word, and take bookmarks and registration forms to other guilds. Karen requested volunteers to assist with distribution of publicity items to quilt shops they may frequent in outer areas. Linda Wirtz gave a reminder to submit registration forms quickly and Lana Higginbotham encouraged members to donate items for the small quilt auction. Robin Meyer, Vickie Lord and Ray Barreras donated items for the small auction.

With 102 out of 136 members present and 23 proxies, quorum was met for voting to proceed on a proposed revision to the Guild's 2009 budget. Danielle Morgan presented the details of the revision: As a result of changes in St. Ann's billing process in 2008 the guild was not billed for the monthly setup and takedown fee that is part of our contract with the church. These fees were not taken into consideration when the 2009 budget was prepared. The budget revision provides funding in the amount of \$1,049 to cover both the 2008 and 2009 setup and takedown fees. Melinda Fulkerson made a motion to accept the budget revision as presented with a 2nd on the motion by Ray Barreras. The members accepted the budget revision.

Following a brief break, door prizes were awarded and Danielle Morgan introduced Kathy Kansier, guest speaker. Kathy's presentation was "Is There A Winning Quilt in Your Future?"

Danielle Morgan adjourned the meeting at 11:50 a.m.

PRECIOUS SUNBONNET QUILTS



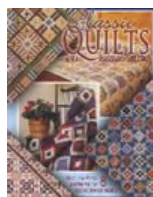

THE CIRCUIT RIDER'S QUILT - Jennifer Dick



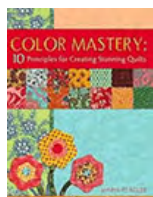

Harriett's Helpful Hints

- * While your quilts may be, your needles are Not heirlooms, to be passed down from generation to generation. Bite the bullet- throw away dull ones and use a new one every now and then! This applies to both hand and machine needles.
- * Be safe with your trash. Keep an empty pill bottle near your sewing supplies to put old needles and bent pins in. When it's full, you can safely put it in the wastebasket.
- * I use a margarine tub to dispose of rotary cutting blades. When there are several in it, I give it to guild member Pat Kilmark, who sends them to a charity group that uses them.
- * If you need help gripping a needle while hand sewing, you can cut the fingers off latex gloves, and slip the fingertip over your finger. Not the heavy, dishwashing kind of latex gloves, but the thin ones that medical personnel use. You can get them at drug stores. They seem a little thicker than the finger cots you can buy at quilt stores, so they last a little longer. And they're economical- five finger cots per glove, and different sizes too!

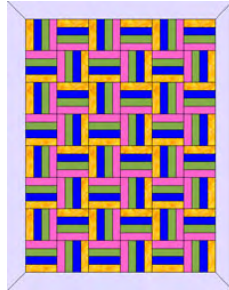

What is Golden Scissors? How Do I Get One?

A small scissors charm is given to members who make a quilt that meets the following guidelines:

1. The quilt must be completed within one year of the date the scissors are awarded.
2. The quilt top must be made by the owner, except for block of the month, friendship, and whole cloth quilts.
3. All quilting must be done by the owner.
4. The quilt must have a perimeter of at least 280 inches.
5. The quilt must be presented to the Golden Scissors Committee Chairperson before the general membership meeting is called to order. The quilt shall be measured and the criteria recorded. The golden Scissors will be presented to the maker, who may display the quilt during the golden Scissors portion of the meeting.
6. If you quilt is entirely hand quilted, you will receive a thimble.

Georgia Celebrates Quilts – 2009

Meet the Show Committee!

Each month, we'll highlight the work of several show committees, so that you'll have a better idea of what each one involves.

The **Judging Committee** is responsible for hiring the judges, organizing the judging process, and communicating the results. As the quilts are delivered, volunteers arrange them in categories, waiting for the judges to arrive. The Judging Committee and the judges must ensure that entries are in the proper category, and that the show rules are carried out. As the judges work, their decisions are carefully documented, so that comments come back with all the entries. At the end of judging, the Committee issues the list of awards.

Sponsors and Ads in the program are important to the financial success of the show. This committee contacts potential sponsors and advertisers and works with them to get copy ready for the program and the signage at the show. Some sponsors return year after year, but it's always a challenge to add to the list of local businesses that support the show.

One of the most popular aspects of our show are the **Vendors**. The Vendor Committee is responsible for selecting vendors, getting their contracts signed, receiving their payments, assigning spaces, and coordinating with the vendors throughout the show. Set-up of the poles and drapes in this area is also the Committee's responsibility.

The Guild's **Website** is an integral part of the show. Our webmaster posts the entry forms and rules, links to important committee members, general publicity and information for visitors to the show, and lots more. The webmaster is a member of the Quilt Show Committee and in that role, collects a wide variety of information that makes the show portion of the website the "go to" place for up-to-date information about the show.

New to the show this year are **Workshops** held at our local quilt shops and sewing machine dealers. The shops will decide what and when to teach various quilting classes, and we will promote the availability of the classes through our website and other publicity. We hope to increase our attendance by making the trip to the show more attractive to quilters with a greater distance to travel.
