

Helpful Hints for Workshop Participants

When you send in the registration form, be sure to keep the top half of the form. It contains information about the time and location of the workshop and what to bring, such as lunch.

If you do not have the top half of the form, return to the website to view the registration form.

Maps to the various workshop locations are available on the website.

Be sure and print off the supply list for each individual class. If you have questions about a particular item, don't hesitate to call Carol. Other participants may be willing to share. Just don't bring your entire stash!

Plan to arrive at the workshop about 30 minutes prior to listed start time. Teachers like to start on time.

Each class has an assigned "Proctor". The Proctor does not take the class, but is there to assist the teacher and also help the participants.

Be sure your machine is in good working order and bring your machine's manual, just in case.

Bring a sack lunch. There is a refrigerator at most workshop sites.

An extra extension cord is helpful to have. We provide multi plugs. We also provide irons and ironing boards, and unless a teacher specifically requests that each person have an iron and board, it is not necessary to bring one.

Dress in layers. The temperature in the room is sometimes difficult to regulate.

Taking a workshop is one of the best "deals" that the guild has to offer and we hope you will enjoy the experience and gain both knowledge and new friends.
